

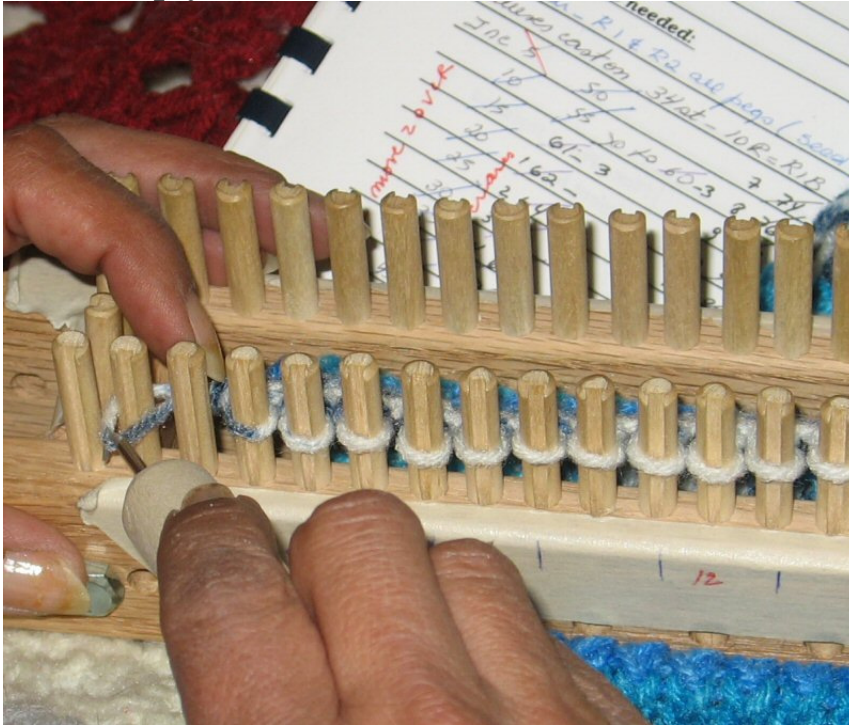
Increases:

To decrease we will be moving the pegs to the outside of the work.

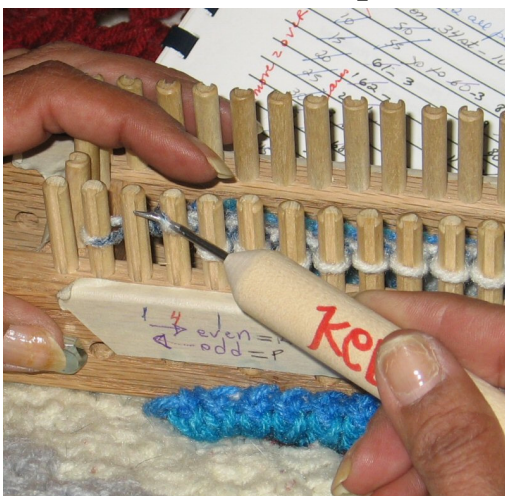
The pictures show an increase done on the left side.

I like to leave 2 or 3 pegs as a margin, and then make the increase, I think, this way, leaves a nicer slanted edge to the piece.

Move the outside peg, over to the left peg, now the second peg from the end is empty.



Now we move the loop that is on the third peg to the second peg:



Now we will fill in the empty peg, with the stitch that lays under the 4th. Peg. Pick up with pick tool this “dash” and transfer it to the empty peg.



Now, wrap as usual and knit off.
